

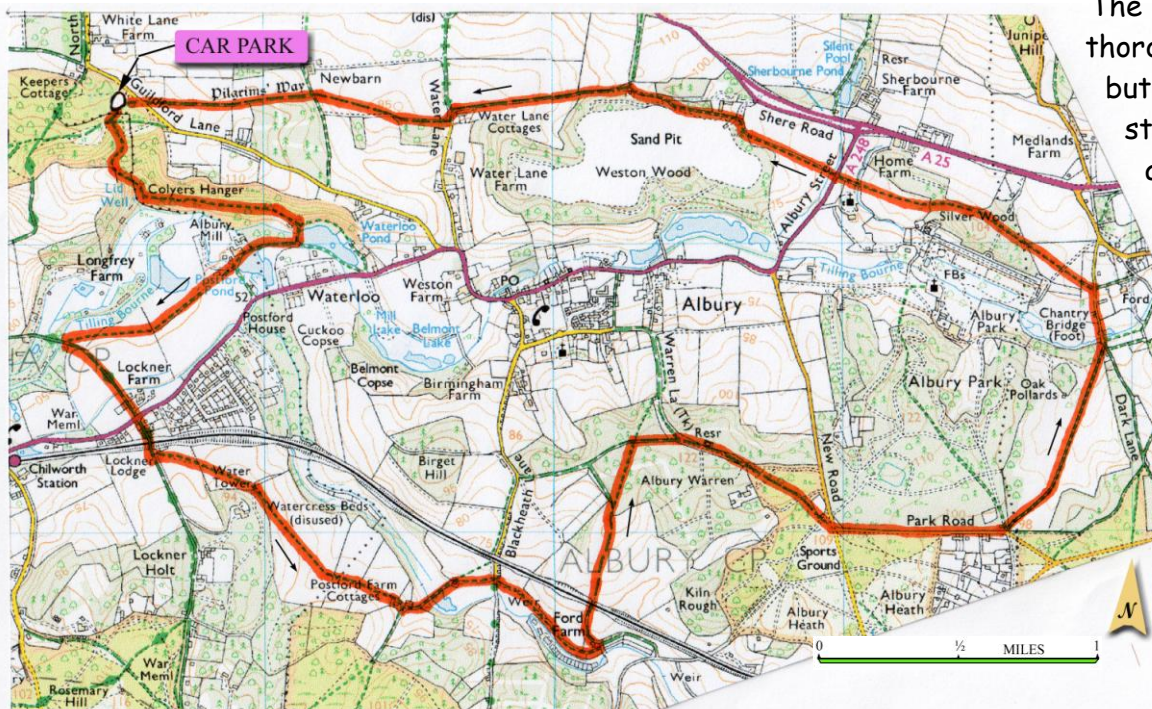


TWERPS

The West End Rambling for Pleasure Society

Sunday 12th June 2011

We would like to thank Keith, Ann, Ken and Beulah for their efforts over the last couple of months in leading walks and generally sorting out the problems that arose from our absence. We are coming up to the middle of the year with promises of excellent walking weather for the June walks so get your boots out. The main walk, on the 12th, covers some ground that we have traversed recently but also involves paths not trodden since 2002.



The 6½ mile walk is thoroughly enjoyable but note that the stinging nettles are growing strongly at this time of the year and there are 6 stiles that need to be climbed. There is a steep descent at the start and one short, sharp, climb near the end but mostly the ups and downs

are not too strenuous. We should be back at the car park well before 2 p.m.

The start is, as usual, at 10:00 a.m. at the St. Martha's car park in Guildford Lane (OS Explorer map 145 TQ 035 485) The route we suggest to reach the car park is to go past Newlands Corner on the A25 and, after just over a mile further on, turn right onto the A248 and drive through Albury. Out of Albury, after the road bears round to the right and then sharply to the left, take the next road off to the right which is Guildford Lane. This single track road rises to pass some cottages on the right and then starts to descend gently to reach our starting point on the left.

The midsummer stroll, this year, on Friday 24th June and starts from a footpath some 250 yards past The Red Lion pub on Red Lion Road at 7:00 p.m. (OS Explorer map 145 SU 977 621). To get to the start head north out of Chobham on the B383 (Windsor Road), for about $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile, to reach Red Lion Road on the right. Parking both on and off the road is available there.
