



# TWERPS

*The West End Rambling for Pleasure Society*

**Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> June 2017**

**T**his month's walk starts on Cookham Moor near the delightful village of Cookham, of Stanley Spencer fame. The route crosses a golf course and then farm land to take us to what I would describe as the only uphill section of the walk, to go through Quarry Wood and then down into Marlow via a bridge built and designed by William Tierney Clark in 1832. He also was the designer and builder of the, perhaps, more famous Hammersmith bridge. In Marlow, our half way point, we can enjoy a break in the Higginson Park.

There is a Costa Coffee house where drinks and snacks may be purchased. From Marlow we continue our walk along the Thames Path where we can admire the wildlife, expensive houses and boats! The walk is a little over 8 miles long and will take an estimated 4½ hours not including breaks.

To get to Cookham Moor from West End, head to the A308 which will take you into Maidenhead. Go under the railway lines and then at the next roundabout go onto the A4. Go through 2 more roundabouts on the A4; then at the next roundabout; just before the river go left to Cookham, on the A4094. After about 2½ miles you will reach Cookham and in the centre of Cookham turn left onto the B4447. The car park is

½-a-mile on the right.

West End to car parking at Cookham Moor - about 50 mins. **Walk No. 378**
