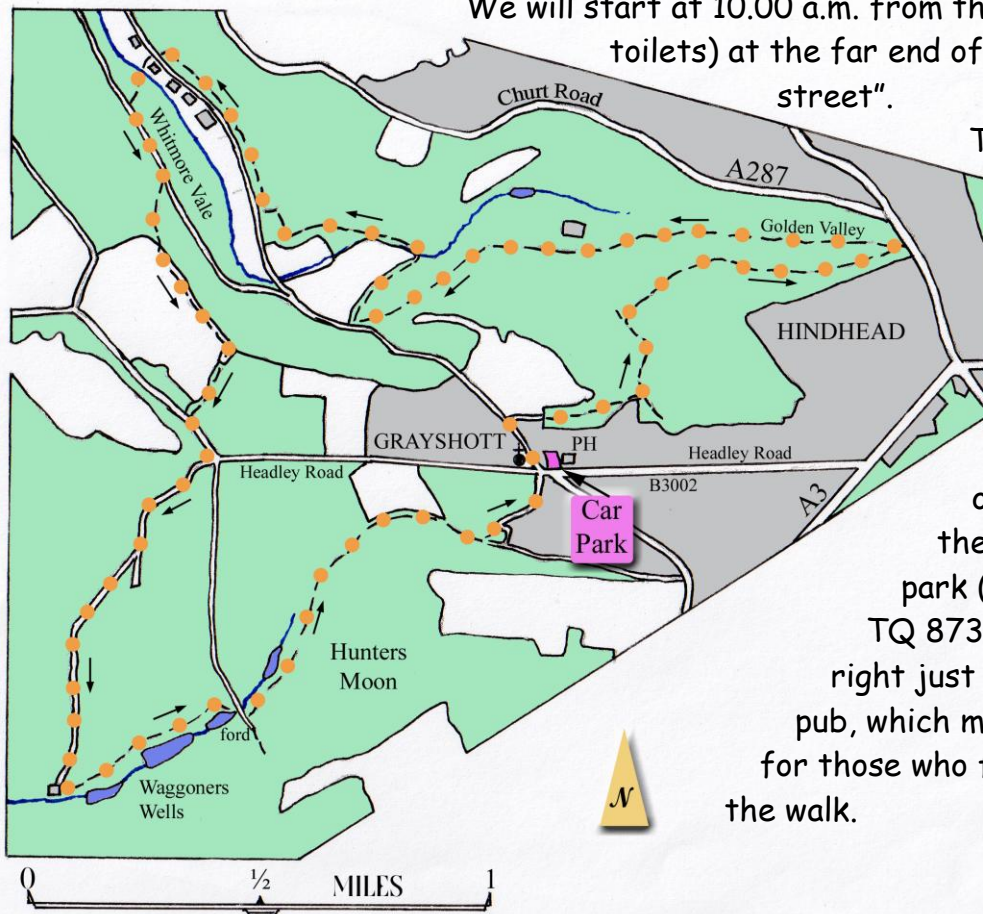
The West End Rambling for Pleasure Society

Sunday 13th September 2009

Thanks to Ken for leading the August walk at Shalford and for offering to lead the next one at Friday Street in October. Our walk this month is from Grayshott, a pleasant little village in Hampshire. We will wander around the Golden Valley area and then return via Waggoners Wells. These pretty ponds were built to supply power to a local iron smelting industry about two hundred years ago. The ponds were taken over by the National Trust after Sir Robert Hunter had organised their purchase and made the area available to the public in 1919.

This 7 mile walk (only one stile) is reasonably "up and downy" in parts mainly through woodland but with interesting viewpoints. Bring a snack for a stop somewhere on the way.

We will start at 10.00 a.m. from the public car park (with toilets) at the far end of Grayshott "high street".



The best approach is along the A3. At Hindhead continue ahead over the traffic lights for 500 yards and turn right just past the garage onto the B3002. Carry on for $\frac{3}{4}$ mile through the village and the car park (OS Explorer map 133 - TQ 873 354) is located on the right just past the Fox & Pelican pub, which might be a useful venue for those who fancy a pub lunch after the walk.

West End to Grayshott - about 45 mins. **Walk No. 278**

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
