



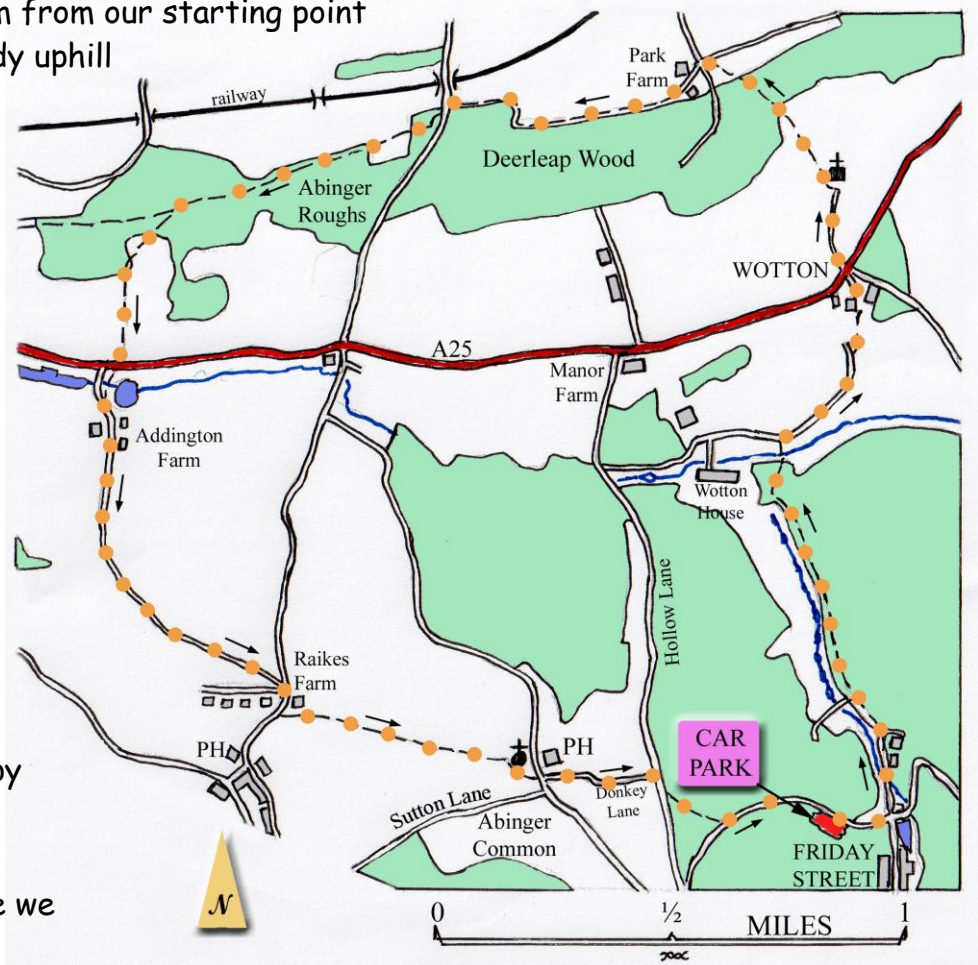
# TWERPS

**Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> October 2009**

Thanks to Ken who has kindly offered to be the leader for this month's 6 mile walk which starts at the picturesque location of Friday Street; one of the many little secret village sites that can be found tucked away in the Surrey Hills. We walk along the valley of the Tillingbourne for about half of the distance and then of course as we will have walked downstream from our starting point we have to make a steady uphill ascent to get back to the car park. There are about 6 stiles along the route and a nice pub on the way at Abinger Hatch.

Nicholas and I are looking for some willing helpers to lead walks in February and March then because we are going out to New Zealand to have a holiday in some warmer weather - we hope. We are quite happy to pre-walk these walks with people to help with navigation points before we depart if necessary.



You can reach the start point of this month's walk by driving along the A25 from Newlands Corner to pass through Gomshall and Abinger Hammer. After a further 1½ miles turn right into Hollow Lane (signposted to Abinger Hammer, Friday Street and Leith Hill). About a mile later take a narrow, acute, left turn to arrive at the car park (OS Explorer map 146 - TQ 125 458) on the right after half a mile.
