

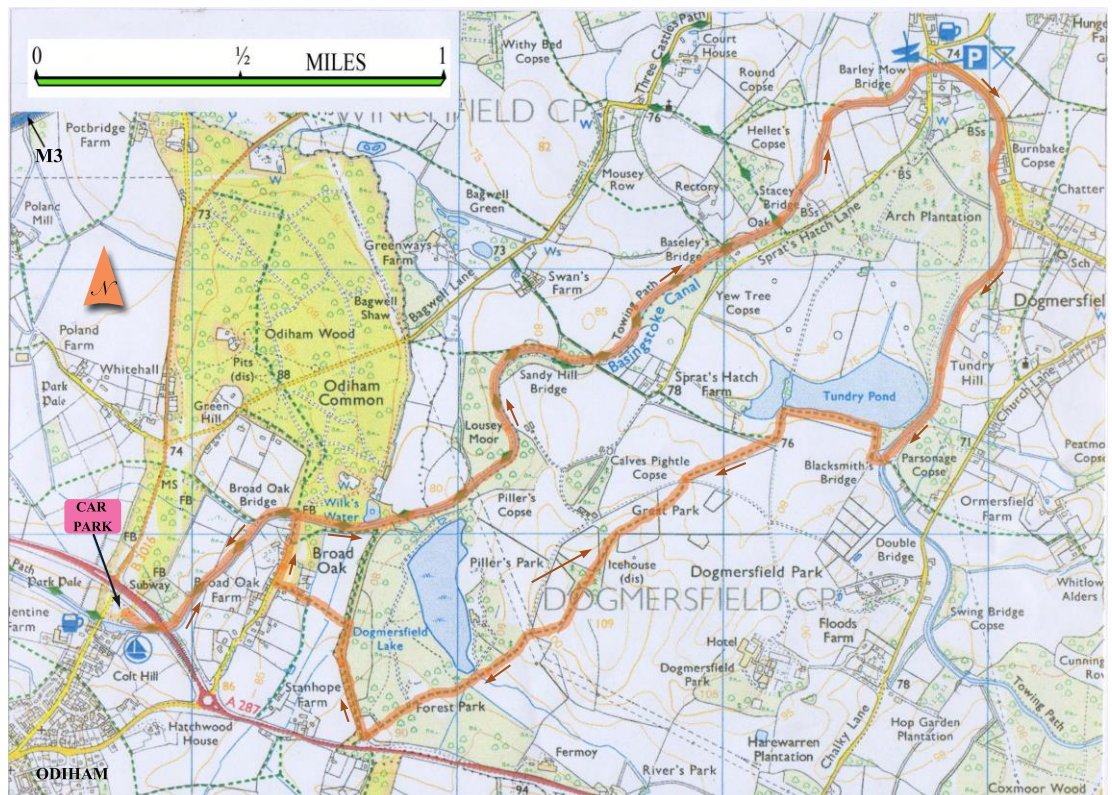


TWERPS

The West End Rambling for Pleasure Society

Sunday 10th December 2017

The walk starts off along the towpath of the Basingstoke Canal. This waterway is little used nowadays and some signs along the route give information of why and how it was constructed. There are only 2 stiles on the route and the terrain is virtually flat; with only a little mud towards the end.



To reach the starting point exit the M3 at Junction 5 onto the A287 signposted to Farnham. After just under $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile continue ahead at the roundabout still on the A287. After a further $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles, at a second roundabout, go right into the village of Odiham. After about 700 yards take a sharp right turning into London Road and drive along to the end of the cul-de-sac where there are 2 large bins. Here turn right to enter the car park at the far end.

There is a pub called The Water Witch, within walking distance of our carpark, that we can recommend. Please let us know if you want us to book you in for lunch.

West End to London Road, Odiham, car park - about 35 mins. **Walk No. 383**
