#### **West End Fete**


Held back in June, our stand was visited by our (then) MP Michael Gove, prospective candidate Ed McGuinness and Councillor Pat Tedder.

Surrey Heath Borough Council (SHBC) has published the final draft of its Local Plan, which sets out policies to shape the Borough's future for the next 15 years. It deals with housing, planning, infrastructure, employment, transport, the environment and so on. The draft is published for consultation with the public, with 20 September the deadline for comments. When SHBC has considered the responses and made any alterations, the Local Plan will be submitted to the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government for approval or amendment.

WEVS is studying the Local Plan and will submit responses, but individual residents are encouraged to comment as well. The contents of the Plan and details of how to comment can be found online at

Two of the topics of particular concern to West End are housing and the Green Belt.

The draft Local Plan states that the Borough has a housing target of 5,578 new houses to be provided between 2019 and 2038. Of these, 1,501 are already built and 1,990 have existing planning permissions, leaving sites to be found for 2,087 homes between now and 2038. That averages about 140 new homes per year.

Whether this modest annual target will survive submission to the Ministry unaltered is open to doubt. The new Government issued a statement on 30 July formally announcing that the rate of housebuilding will be increased significantly by means of setting mandatory house-building targets for each planning authority.

The draft Local Plan allocates most of the new homes to Camberley Town Centre, and most of the rest to other sites in the west of the Borough. New building in our rural east of the Borough, which is mainly Green Belt or has other protections, is more or less limited to infilling within existing settlement areas.

West End is surrounded by Green Belt land (see Page 4), and very little land within West End's settlement boundary is available for new housing, under current rules. West End's allocation in the draft Local Plan for the 2019-2038 period is 276 new houses, but 238 are already completed and one has planning permission, leaving 37 to find. Sixteen of these are listed for infilling on 'reserve land' east of Benner Lane.

It is likely that part of WEVS' comments to SHBC will be about the importance of maintaining current Green Belt boundaries.

Do read the draft Local Plan yourself and submit any comments by 20 September.

#### **Did You Know?**

The Green Belt surrounding West End is shown in green below. The areas to the West - not in green - are "Special Protection Areas". These have far greater protection from development.

#### **The Boxing Day Walk**

Weather permitting, WEVS plans to hold its traditional Boxing Day walk this year. The route the walk follows will very much depend upon the amount of rainfall we have in the weeks before the event. Normally it covers a distance of around three miles, although the walk is designed so that those less inclined to complete it can easily return home before the end. The first half of the walk is relatively dry under foot and child buggy friendly. Mid-way there is an exit point where those who have had enough, or have other tasks to perform, can return to the village by road. Participants assemble in the car park of Tringham Hall for a 10:30 start, or wait near the Hare & Hounds to join it shortly afterwards. Come suitably attired with warm clothing & sensible footwear. The route takes walkers across Brentmoor Heath and around the back of the village, ending up back at the Hare & Hounds about 1½ hours later, just in time to take some well-earned refreshments.

#### West End High Street 'Corner' Shop

The two daughters of Eli Allen had the shop built and it opened c1920. By 1930 the whole family, Eli, Annie Marie, Ada, Elizabeth and Frank were living at the shop which was called Kimmerdale. After the death of their parents, Frank, Ada and Elizabeth ceased living at the shop and moved to a new bungalow on the main road. It is unclear for how long they continued to run the shop.

Frank Gibbs who lived in Fellow Green ran a Sunday Newspaper delivery business from his house before taking over the Newsagents c1960. For his retirement in 1971 he built a bungalow on land behind the shop in Streets Heath. Around 2000, the bungalow was demolished and two new detached houses built on the site.

The shop was taken over by Bill Stratton and his wife on September 12<sup>th</sup> 1971 and Mr. Patel took over from him c1985. In May 2007, Bhavisha and Naimesh Patel took over the shop, changing the name. When the Post Office in the High Street closed in 2008 it was reinstated at the renamed Shivs Convenience Store. Sadly, it closed and the WEVS Newsletter of August 2019 carried the following: "we were sad to learn that Shiv Convenience Store would be closing its doors on 31<sup>st</sup> August 2019. Bhavisha and Naimesh Patel have been serving our village community since May 2007 and the shop and Post Office will be missed. We understand the family are staying in the village and that Bhavisha will continue to cook Spice Valley takeaways. WEVS would like to thank the Patel family for their support over the years, especially in collecting WEVS subscriptions on our behalf, and we wish them all the best for the future".

#### **New Clinic For Those With Hearing Aids**

There were jubilant scenes at Gordon's as the A Level and GCSE results were released. In the A Levels, over two fifths of students achieved A\* to A grades, securing their next steps, including two to Oxbridge; five to medical school; four on sports scholarships to overseas universities and a number on degree apprenticeships.

In the GCSE results, four fifths of students achieved a 'strong' pass of five or better with over half graded 9-7 and 84 per cent achieving grades 9-5.

The Summer recess saw Sixth Form students completing their Gold Duke of Edinburgh's Award Scheme with 36 students trekking in the Black Mountains for their five day practice expedition followed by a further five days in Snowdonia.



Meanwhile, the Pipes and Drums have been travelling the country and continent, performing for the Last Post Association's ceremony at Menin Gate in Ypres and competing in the Scottish Pipe Band Championships. Their trip to Glasgow in August for the World Pipe Band Championships also saw them taking part in "Piping Live!" one of Scotland's major cultural and musical events.

Back in West End, the school site has undergone building work and maintenance. Barracudas activity camps have taken up residence as well as visiting clubs using the sports facilities, and the impeccably behaved dogs from the Surrey Police Dogs School also returned to the school for training!

Just before breaking up for the end of term, hundreds of students painted, baked, gardened, picked up litter and helped in primary schools and care homes for Gordon's School's "Make a Difference Day".

The event gave back to communities in West End and further afield, as students litter picked on West Wittering and Littlehampton beaches. The churchyards at Bisley and Holy Trinity, West End saw students clearing weeds and cutting back undergrowth. The graves of orphans living at the school, which was formerly Gordon Boys' Home for necessitous boys, were cleared of debris and cleaned.

Residents of the Princess Christian Care Centre and the White Lodge Centre were visited by students, who helped plant flowers and played games with residents. At Carwarden House School and Tringham Pre-School, students facilitated sports events while at Peter Pan Pre-School they painted a shed, complete with mural!

The school also welcomed the community (and their picnic blankets!) for a glorious celebration of the creative arts for the annual Summer Arts Evening with entertainment provided by students, staff, Holy Trinity School and the Gordon's Singers.

#### **Unveiling The Stag**

West End Village Society (WEVS) celebrated the installation of its landmark sculpture of a red deer stag on one of its two roundabouts on the A322. The installation represents the many red deer located on the military land (a large part of which is included in West End Parish) adjacent to Brentmoor Heath in West

End. This is the culmination of a major project undertaken by WEVS, which has taken several years to reach fruition, partly caused by the interruption of Covid 19, and was only made possible by the generosity of local people and organisations who contributed to the fund.

On Monday 1<sup>st</sup> July 2024, a plaque, sited close to the sculpture, listing the major contributors, was unveiled by Surrey County Councillor, Rebecca Jennings-Evans.



The event was attended by local councillors, contributors and WEVS committee members.
