History Project - 2025

Most members of WEVS will be familiar with the work of John Smith who founded the West End History Project in 2004. He has amassed an immensely valuable collection of photographs and documents of our village spanning the last hundred years or so. John has mounted fascinating displays of historic pho-

tographs in the WEVS marquee at the village fetes and Ag & Hort Shows, in Surrey Heath's Heritage Centre, and in the West End Social Club. He has also written numerous articles in the Parish News magazine and elsewhere. He was deservedly awarded the accolade of Citizen of the Year in 2014 by the Parish Council.

John now plans to retire from the Project and no longer accepts new material. His final work will be cataloguing his 4,000+ photographs in print format.

WEVS will now be taking over the History Project and continuing it into the future. It will be WEVS' Project of the Year 2025, and will be led by Johan Schoeman, Savitri Kegge and myself.

At WEVS we will build our own digital collection of photographs with the aim of making it freely available online (with permission from those submitting photos) in a new section of WEVS' website.

Parish Fetes and Garden Parties (from the Parish Magazine)

June 1916

A Garden Fete will be held in the Vicarage Garden on Wednesday June 21st 1916 by kind permission of Lieut E C and Mrs Bruce. To be opened at three o' clock, fruit, refreshments, fancy and other stalls. Military Concert at six o' clock. The band of the Gordon Boy's Home will attend, by kind permission of Col R Wynyard. Admission is sixpence; after 6, threepence, children, twopence. You will notice we have arranged for the Garden Fete to be held on Wednesday 21st [the longest day], when we hope the roses will be in full bloom and the strawberries ripe.

This year we are asking you to help with the Church Maintenance Fund. The Church wardens are asking for £9 towards the Organists salary, and I have advanced the last £6 on the Oak Choir Seats. We are most anxious to have a clean slate before we begin the Churchyard. Will you all do your utmost? If you cannot be present at the Fete, please send something to the Church wardens.

July 1916

Our Third Garden Fete and first Trinity Fair took place on Wednesday June 21st. We were favoured with a beautiful day, and the event being well advertised drew a large number of people. We hope to give more particulars in our next issue.

September 1916

The Committee wishes to thank very heartily those who sent money, fruit, flowers, plants, butter, eggs and vegetables: those who lent grounds, marquee, flags, crockery and conveyances: those who arranged the Baby Show: those who gave their services in entertaining and in providing music, especially the Band of the Gordon Boy's Home: and all who assisted at the Stalls and Competitions, and in the necessary preparing and clearing, which does so much towards making the day a great success. A proof of the interest taken is shown by the fact that over eighty parishioners and children helped in the above work.

July 1918

The Garden Fete has been fixed for Wednesday, August 7th. Colonel Wynyard has kindly promised the band. In fixing the date, we have had the children of the Parish chiefly in our minds, so that they may have a happy day during their summer holidays. Mr J Harrison Dakin has kindly arranged that they shall be admitted free and that every child shall have a war time tea.

July 1920

The Annual Garden Fete and Parish Gathering which was held on the Vicarage Lawns on Wednesday, June 9th, was a great success. We were favoured with a glorious afternoon, the members of the Committee put their hearts into their work and the result is a record. The splendid band of the Gordon Boy's Home played during the afternoon and for the dancing in the evening.

The Committee wish to thank all those who assisted by work or gifts. The accounts have not yet been made up owing to our having to pay the entertainment tax which we are hoping to get refunded. A balance sheet will be published in next month's Magazine.

Tree Wardens Yvette Jones

West End tree wardens (Yvette Jones and Savitri Kegge) joined forces with two other tree enthusiasts from Camberley (Jerry Brownlee and Trefor Hogg) to form Surrey Heath Tree Wardens in 2018. The charity was set up and the original four were joined by other Trustees, committee members and volunteers to create a thriving team dedicated to preserving the green canopy of Surrey Heath. Regular volunteer groups work on a variety of projects in the Borough. These have included making outdoor classrooms for schools, opening up overgrown woodland areas (removing non-native and rampant species) and of course planting many thousands of whips, saplings and trees.

On January 28th a work party will commence removal of laurel and invasive species from the small copse next to West End village pond on the recreation ground. This will probably take a couple of sessions so if you would like to get involved please take a look at Surrey Heath Tree Wardens facebook page [https://www.facebook.com/groups/SurreyHeathTreeWardens/]. All of our scheduled activities are listed and reported there.

The copse by the pond was dedicated to the late John Straver at its inception. Information in the Parish Council minutes dated 13th February 1980, kindly provided by historian, John Smith, lists the tree species offered as: 3 Salix tristis, 5 Poplar nigra italica, 5 Poplar alba, 5 Cherry hisakura, 5 Sorbus acuparia, 9 Acer platanoides, 7 Betula pendula, 7 Tilia platyphilis rubra and 10 Acer ginnala. It is noted that, "Messrs. Hillings Nurseries be asked to carry out the work in March." It appears Mr. S Kemp had proposed the planting of trees on the south side of the Recreation Ground at a previous meeting in January 1980.

It will be interesting to see if we can identify any of the original trees, now over 45 years of age!

Songs of Praise

If you enjoy singing or listening to hymns you might like to come and join us for Songs of Praise. This event is held on the second Tuesday of every month (not January and February) at **Holy Trinity Church.** It starts at **2.30pm** and we usually sing about 8 hymns which have often been chosen by people who attended the previous Songs of Praise. We hear a little about the origin of each song and its writer and composer before singing



or just listening. We are fortunate to have the hymns played on our church organ. After this we have tea



and cake in the vestry or outside in the good weather. It's a time to chat and get to know each other and select some hymns for next time. Communion is often available at 4pm after these refreshments.

The church now has new under pew heating and cushions on the seats so do come and try them out and join us for an afternoon of music and friendship!

Gordon's School

The 140th anniversary of the founding of Gordon's School site as the National Memorial to General Gordon is being celebrated this year with a host of events planned throughout!

This month, as well as making the annual parade along Whitehall to the statue of General Gordon on the Thames Embankment, the 60-strong Pipes and Drums Band began their anniversary tour of places associated with General Gordon. This included visiting memorials to General Gordon at St Paul's Cathedral and Westminster Abbey as well as performing there. The tour will also take in the monuments at the Brompton Barracks, Chatham; Gravesend; Southampton and Windsor Castle.

The Band will also lead the student body in walking from Brookwood Station to the school, recreating the march when 100 'necessitous' boys travelled from their temporary base at Fort Wallington near Fareham

to take up residence at their new home in West End.

Gordon's was originally built by public subscription at the insistence of Queen Victoria who demanded a fitting memorial to the Victorian war hero General Charles Gordon and who became the first in an unbroken line of sovereign patrons. Originally the home taught children a trade but in 1943 it became the Gordon Boys' School, later admitting girls in 1990 when the school was renamed Gordon's School. You can volunteer for either or both roles and commit as little or as much time as you want on an ad hoc basis.

Drivers are needed to take clients, who do not have families or friends who can help them, to hospital and doctor appointments (and we all know how hard it is to get to our local hospitals via public transport). Duty Officers answer the phone between 10:00 and 12:00, log the request and send out a WhatsApp message or phone to find a driver who can help (drivers are reimbursed for their mileage). At the time of writing this article we have fulfilled 795 jobs since 2nd January 2024 and the need is increasing.

Pirbright Military Heritage Trail

Many of you have probably noticed the new waymarked trail that goes through the village. Its been created by the Defense Infrastructure Organisation (DIO) in collaboration with other groups. There are 13 information posts around the 12 mile circuit, and they are marked (in both directions) on finger posts. It is on a 'multiuser path' so you can walk, cycle or ride the route. The nearest information post (#6) is about 200m north of the end of Brentmoor Road on the stony track.

If you plan to walk it, I suggest going clockwise, that way you get to Deepcut Café or The Frog about two thirds of the way round.





The 2025 fete will be held on Saturday 14 June. The theme is "Transportation – celebrating 200 years of the railway".


