WEST END VILLAGE SOCIETY ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

Held Tuesday 10th March 2026 at 19.30pm in Tringham Hall

1. Present.

2. Approval of previous AGM Minutes.

The minutes of 18th February 2025 AGM (copy available on screen) were taken as read and approved by the meeting. Proposed Guy Consterdine, seconded Jeff Llewellyn.

3. **Matters Arising.** Any matters arising will be dealt with later in the meeting,

4. Chairman's Report.

Pete Jones welcomed everyone to the meeting and gave details of the committee. There had been six committee meetings.

- A spring walk was held on 23rd March, which proved very successful.
- The usual stall was held at the Village Fete on 8th June, which was well supported.
- There was a VE80 display at the West End Social Club, which was very popular.
- There was the usual stall at the Agricultural & Horticultural Show on the 13th September, which again was well supported.
- WEVS laid a wreath on Remembrance Sunday, 9th November.
- WEVS took part in the bi-annual Christmas Tree Festival at Holy Trinity Church
- The Boxing Day Walk was successful with approximately 70 walkers.
- There are sub-groups for Comms, History and Trees.

6. Previous Projects.

Previous projects were bulb planting, installing a seat on the heath, the community orchard, creation of a footpath, the history group, tree planting and crocus planting

It was reported that there were ongoing problems with the lighting of the Stag, which was proving very difficult to achieve. This is ongoing and further updates will be provided. The stag did however sport a red nose at Christmas again.

7. Donations to Good Causes.

It was advised that as costs have been increasing, no donations had been made to good causes this year.

8. Project of the Year 2026.

This is still under discussion and will be decided at the next Committee meeting. Possible ideas include

- A Seat on the Sangs/Heath
- Continuation of the history project
- Bee/insect friendly flowers

9. Membership

- Paid up 2025 417 (this will increase)
- Paid up 2024 490 (+38)
- Paid up 2023 501 (+19)

The numbers in brackets are the increase from last year.

Advanced payments:

- 2026 and later 183

Numbers are going down slightly. More distributors are needed and new members need to be recruited.

10. Treasurers Report.

The accounts were shown on screen, and it was noted that there was a £660.13 deficit at the end of December 2025, although there is £7435.49 in the bank. The printing of the newsletter is the major expense.

11. Newsletters & Digital Only Bulletins

- Three newsletters are published each year. End of January (before the AGM), end of May (before the Fete) and end of August (before the Ag & Hort Show).
- The print run is 470 with 12 colour pages, through Knaphill Print.
- 232 are emailed.
- We launched regular Digital Bulletins in September 2025, to those members whose email addresses we hold, in order to provide any updates on Village matters. We aim to produce approximately six per year.

12. Facebook

- We use the Facebook page to spread the word about WEVS and other Village events to people on the wider West End/Chobham/Bisley/Lightwater community by posting on various Facebook community groups.

15. Fete and Show

- The Fete and Show were very successful in 2025 and WEVS will once more be having stalls which will show photographs and may include a game, following the previous success of the 'Buzz Game'.

16. Planning.

- There had been no major planning issues.
- It was noted that the speed limit on the A322 in West End and Bisley had now been reduced.
- It is likely that the speed limit on the Lightwater Bypass will be reduced.
- We are aware of an application for open storage in Lucas Green Road will result in more vehicles.

17. Tree Group

- The tree group is part of Surrey Heath Tree Wardens and works throughout Surrey Heath.
- The Community Orchard is steadily improving.
- West End Copse by the recreation ground has now had the laurel removed and it is planned to plant saplings in the autumn.

18. West End History Project.

- WEVS are looking for photographs, documents and stories to digitise. We have 700 plus currently and these will be added to the website in due course.
- WEVS have taken over the display in Surrey Heath Museum.
- A demonstration of the history project and how to access the photographs was given by Johan Schoeman.
